

Tulip Origami

Step-by-step guide



Step 1


We start with the back of the paper

Fold square into a triangle

Unfold the triangle to make a crease


Step 2

 Fold the two corners in to form an upside-down corn shape



Step 3


Fold the two bottom edges to the centre.



Step 4


Fold the two bottom edges to the centre again

To make it even thinner.




Step 5


Turnover the stalk fold it in half from bottom to top



Step 6

Fold across while peeling the back leaf open carefully.





Step 1


We start with the back of the paper

Fold square into a triangle

Unfold the triangle to make a crease

Step 2


Fold across and then unfold to make another crease



Step 3

Turn the paper over

 Fold the square into a rectangle and then unfold to make a horizontal crease




Step 4

Fold across to make another


Rectangle. Then unfold.

So the creases look like a Union Jack



Step 5


 Use the crease to help you fold the paper into a pyramid shape, triangle.




Step 6

Lay the triangle flat

Fold the two front wings up.







Step 7

Flip the triangle over

Fold the remaining two wings up Just like the other side.






Step 8

Flip one of the now sideways triangles over,


like turning a page in a book

Do the same with the back



Step 9


Halve the triangle, bring the tip just over the centre line.



Step 10


Do the same to the other side,

Fold it just across the centre line.




Step 11

Tuck the first wing **inside** the second wing



Step 12


Flip over the paper and repeat step 9,10 and 11 to the other side.




Step 13

Open up the 4 sides

Put the fat side of the shape to your mouth and blow into it








Step 13

Peel the top four triangles so they become the four petals.
